## An Abode of Holistic Education

MGM University was established by the Mahatma Gandhi Mission Trust in 2019 with an objective to provide value-based, research-driven and experiential education that will transform the youth into competent professionals and socially responsible citizens. A number of MGM's colleges in Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar, many of whom shared a rich legacy of around 4 decades, were brought under the umbrella of MGM University (MGMU) to provide them with more autonomy, additional resources, unified administrative structure and a host of other facilities.

Located at the heart of the historical city of Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar in Maharashtra, MGM University's spacious campus is adorned with plenty of trees, sculptures and beautiful artefacts. ### NEP-2020 Implementation

MGM University is one of the first universities in India to fully adopt and implement New Education Policy (NEP-2020). Designed to meet the needs of the 21<sup>st</sup> century, the policy emphasizes holistic development of students through experiential education. In line with the NEP-2020, MGM University provides multidisciplinary, experiential and career-oriented education for all round development of its students. The University has built a state-of-the-art infrastructure and provides world-class educational, research and sports facilities to its students to transform them into successful professionals into their areas of interest. ### Multidisciplinary Education

# 1. Objects of MGM University

Objects of the University as per MGM University Act are:

- To provide learning, teaching, capacity, capability and skills development and research and development in higher and technical education, covering Liberal Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences, Life Sciences and Biotechnologies, Nano-Sciences and Technologies, Professional Disciplines such as Engineering, Technology, Management, Business and Commerce, Applied and Creative Arts, Vocational Education, Media, Information and Communication Technology and Education per se and their interdisciplinary studies and development.
- To provide instructions, teaching and training in Higher and Technical Education, Arts, Sports, Culture, Film, Space Technologies, Marine Research and make provisions for research.
- To create higher levels of cognitive, affective and psychomotor (head, hearts and hands) abilities.
- To create higher levels of intellectual abilities.
- To create and deploy new educational programmes to promote creativity, innovation and entrepreneurship for inventing new ways for development and social reconstruction and transformation.
- To establish state-of-the-art facilities for education and development.
- To carry out teaching and research and offer continuing quality education programmes.
- To create centres of excellence for research and development in Science and Technology and socioeconomic development and for sharing knowledge and its application.
- To use modern and postmodern processes, mechanisms and technologies for governance and management of learning, teaching, researching, evaluating, developing, organizing and creating socioeconomic wealth for individuals and society in 21<sup>st</sup> century.
- To provide professional and development services to the industry and public organizations and society.
- To start higher education programmes, and courses in new and emerging areas with innovative approaches.
- To establish links, collaborations and partnerships with other higher education and research institutions in India and abroad.
- To institute degrees, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions on the basis of examinations, or any other methods of evaluation.
- To establish innovative approaches for the creation of seamlessness in academic structures, learning time-frames, and working and continuous evaluation processes for nurturing and cultivating creativity and entrepreneurship.
- To pursue any other objectives as may be suggested by the Government.
- To ensure that the standard of the degree, diplomas, certificates and other academic distinctions conferred by a University are not lower than those laid down by the All India Council for Technical Education or the National Council for Teacher Education established under the National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993 or the University Grants Commission constituted under the University Grants Commission Act, 1956 or the Pharmacy Council of India constituted under the Pharmacy Act, 1948 or the Bar Council of India constituted under the Advocates Act, 1961 or any other statutory body, as the case may be.

## 2. Powers & Functions of MGM University

Powers and Functions of the University as per MGM University Act are:

- To make provisions and adopt all measures (including adoption and updating of the curricula) in respect of study, teaching and research, relating to the courses through traditional as well as new innovative modes including online education mode.
- To institute and confer degrees, diplomas, certificates, awards, grades, credits and academic distinctions.
- To conduct and hold examinations.
- To provide for the degrees, diplomas, certificates, equivalent or corresponding to the degrees, diplomas, and certificates of other recognized Universities, Boards or Councils.
- To take all necessary measures for setting up the campus.
- To set up a central library, departmental libraries, museums and allied matters.
- To institute and confer honorary degrees as may be prescribed.
- To institute and award fellowships, scholarships, and studentships, as may be specified.
- To take special measures for spreading educational facilities among the educationally backward strata of society.
- To encourage and promote sports and other extracurricular activities.
- To create technical, administrative and other necessary posts and to make appointments thereto.
- To undertake research projects on mutually acceptable terms and conditions.
- To provide consultancy services.
- To frame statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations for carrying out the objects of the University in accordance with the provisions of the Act.
- To encourage and promote co-curricular activities for the personality development of the teachers, students and employees of the University.
- To provide for dual degrees, diplomas or certificates vis-a-vis other universities on a reciprocal basis within and outside the country as per instructions of the State Government, Government of India and University Grants Commission.
- To make such provisions for integrated courses in different disciplines in the educational programmes of the University.
- To set up colleges, institutions and off-campus centres, only within the State, as per the instructions issued by the State Government, Central Government and the University Grants Commission, from time to time.
- To receive donations, gifts and grants and to acquire, hold, manage and dispose of any property, movable or immovable, including trust or endowed property within or outside the State for the purposes and objects of the University and to invest funds.
- To prescribe the fee structure for various courses, from time to time as per provisions of the University Act.
- To demand and receive payments of such fees and other charges as may, from time to time, be specified.
- To seek collaboration with other institutions on mutually acceptable terms and conditions.
- To determine salaries, remunerations, and honoraria to teachers and employees of the University in accordance with the norms, specified by the University Grants Commission and the other regulatory bodies.
- To organize and undertake extra-mural teaching and extension services.
- To establish and maintain Halls and Hostels.
- To recognize, supervise and control Halls and Hostels not maintained by the University and other accommodations for the residence of the students and to withdraw any such recognition.
- To regulate and enforce discipline among students and employees of the University and to take such disciplinary measures as may be deemed necessary.

- To make arrangements for promoting the health and general welfare of the students and the employees of the University.
- To cooperate with any other university in and outside the country, authority or any public or private body having in view of the promotion of purposes and objects similar to those of the University for such purposes as may be agreed upon, on such terms and conditions as may, from time to time, be specified.
- To provide for the printing, re-printing and publication of research and other work, including textbooks, which may be issued by the University.
- To comply and follow, from time to time the provisions of the University Grants Commission (Establishment and Maintenance of Standards in Private Universities) Regulations, 2003 or any other regulations or directions issued by the University Grants Commission.
- To comply with and carry out directives issued by the State Government, from time to time, with reference to the above powers, duties and responsibilities of the University.
- To do all such things as may be necessary, incidental or conducive to the attainment of all or any of the objects of the University.

## 6. NEP 2020 Implementation at University

MGM University has successfully implemented the new National Education Policy with the aim of transforming individuals into 'Global Citizens' in the era of modern technology. 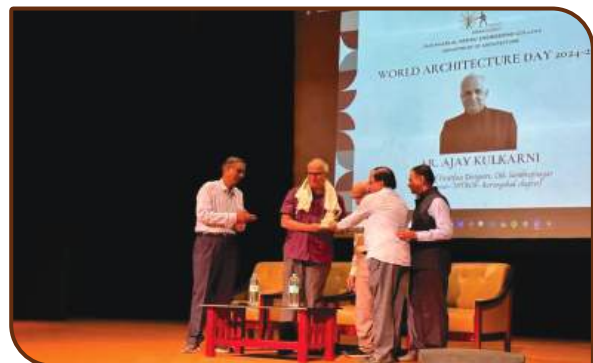

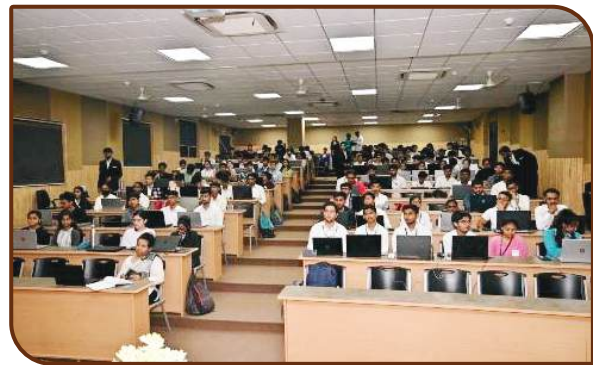

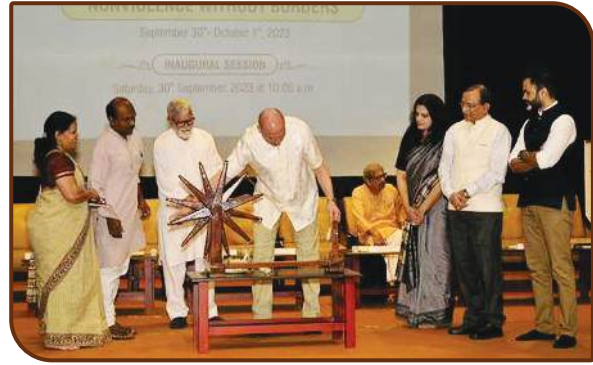

Date: 15/08/2023

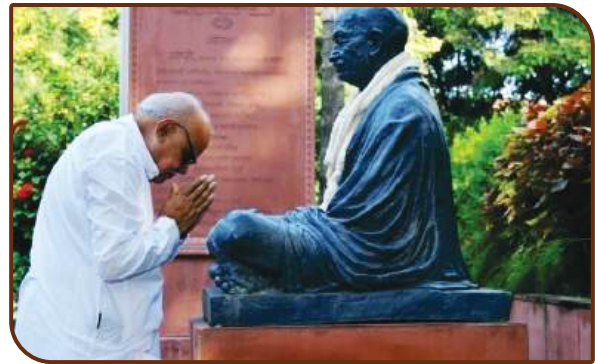

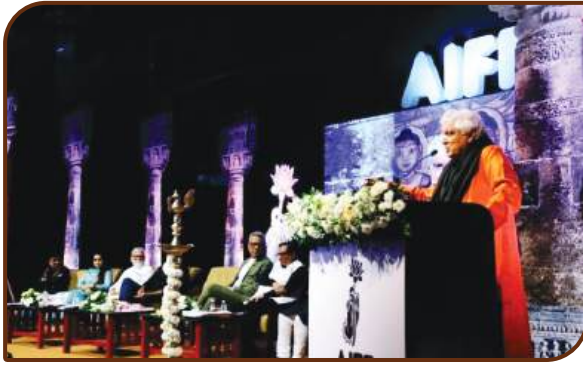

I am particularly amazed by the Marathwada Short Film Competition. I had visited the Ajintha and Ellora caves ten years ago and later came here to see the Devgiri Fort during the production of Panipat. Now, I am here for this 9th edition of the festival, which signifies my personal progress," Mr. Gowariker remarked.

He further added, "I love film festivals, and my growth has been shaped by them. A film festival is a master class for me. It's a place where you watch films from morning till night, and many film lovers should participate in such festivals. The films shown at festivals are not available on OTT platforms. We often watch films alone on OTT, but at a festival, we watch films with everyone. This way, we learn a lot."

The role of the police in films, though indirect, is crucial, and many films wouldn't be complete without us. Police arriving on time is something that filmmakers should take note of, said Special Police IG Dnyaneshwar Chavan.

Municipal Commissioner G. Shrikant said, "We have developed government schemes in Latur by watching domestic films, which have benefited many citizens. I am confident that the Municipal Corporation will participate in future film festivals." He added that cinema inspires us, especially in my role as District Collector.

When this festival started, no one thought it would be so successful, but today it has earned national and international recognition. Next year will mark the 10th year, and we will celebrate this festival in an even grander way, said Nandkishore Kagliwal, Chairman of the Organizing Committee.

Festival Director Ashok Rane remarked, "This film festival has seen tremendous success in a short time. The credit goes to our entire organizing committee. Marathwada's films now have the chance to compete with global cinema through this festival. We are starting a 'Young Critic Lab' this year for students aspiring to be film critics."

The festival has reached new heights in a very short time, with Padma Bhushan Javed Akhtar, Director Ashutosh Gowariker, Director R. Balki, and Director Anubhav Sinha coming to guide and inspire new filmmakers. The standard of the festival is increasing every year. The registration for next year's festival will begin in February 2024, announced Artistic Director Chandrakant Kulkarni.

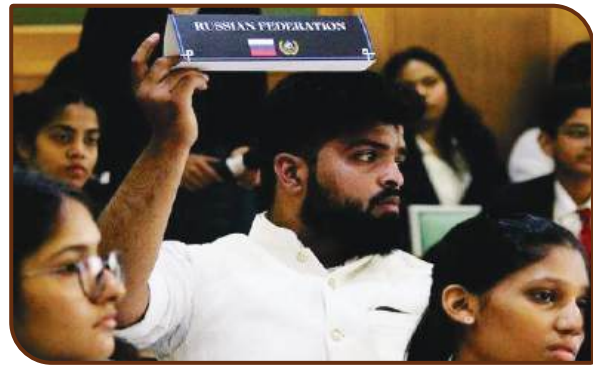

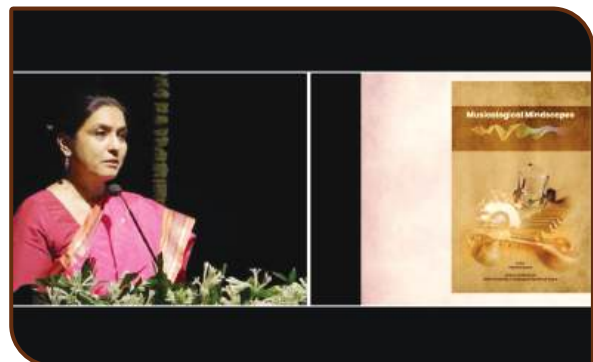

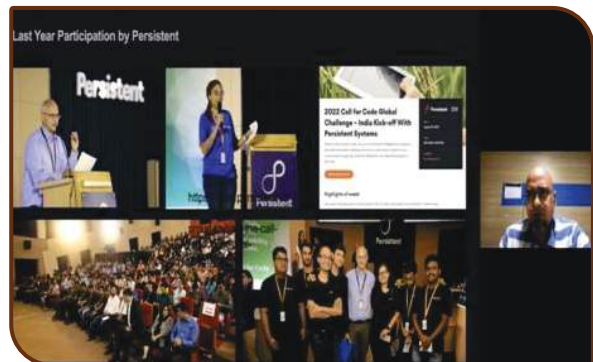

Library also provides facility of OURIGINAL (Part of Turnitine Family-UGC approved Plagiarism Detection Software) (Formerly known as URKUND) anti-plagiarism software to promote ethical research work by the students and researchers.

Central Libraries of MGM University, Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar are state of the art facilities which have a huge and rich collection of books, journals and periodicals. The Libraries is spread over 2,000 square meters across three floors with well designed furniture suited for long duration stay of students in reading rooms. Details of collections, subscriptions, Library services and facilities, integrated management system as below;

**Library automation:** MGMU Libraries automated by JUNO CAMPUS ERP system, Library Configuration, Members, Catalogue, Issue Return, Book-Bank and Reports etc modules are available with OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue) facility in the JUNO CAMPUS ERP Library module system. Every students, researchers and faculty members can check availability of books by using Library OPAC facility. Daily issue-return report, accession register report and other reports facility are available in the ERP system.

**Collection of Books:** MGMU Libraries have huge and rich collection of books, presently that total 1 lakh 62 thousand 590 Volumes of books with 48,000 titles of books available in the MGMU Libraries. By integrating data and processes across different departments like Admission, Finance, Academic, Examination, HR, purchase, stores the ERP system has significantly enhanced operational efficiency, improved decision-making, and promoted transparency and accountability. This report aims to highlight the key contributions of ERP to academic and administrative governance in MGM University which has a user base of approximately 1200 employees and 9,000 students.

### 24.1. Role of ERP in Academics

Streamlining Academic Process. MGMU ERP system plays a crucial role in streamlining academic processes including:

- 24.1.1. **Student Admission:** Processes like Course configuration, admission process, criteria, Seats categories, eligibility of admission, Entrance test, fees, admission cancellations, applicant profile, document management, online forms, ID cards are enabled in ERP system.
- 24.1.2. **Student Management:** ERP system manages student records of entire academic cycle like enrollment, course registration, Managing Courses, Syllabus management, Subject allocation, timetable, attendance, evaluation, feedback, Class register and daily monitoring.
- 24.1.3. **Academics:** An integrated module with academic calendar, academic planning, scheduling, course file, mentoring, practical and projects. Course File includes academic calendar, lesson plan, delivery report, assignments, tests, question banks, subject notes, attendance and evaluation.
- 24.1.4. **Student Internal Assessment:** This module facilitates objective tests, subjective tests, question banks, question paper generation, evaluation scheme, time-bound answering, negative marking, and reports.
- 24.1.5. **Student Online Access:** Through student online access, ERP facilitates ready availability of data and information to the students like their fee structure, payments, generation of receipts, their attendance, curriculum schedules, exam schedules. Students are provided with facility to apply and pay fees for various academic documents and certificates. They are given facility to manage their personal data in student profile includes personal, educational, work experience, contributions and achievements, research, patents, conferences, and related reports
- 24.1.6. **Curriculum Management:** ERP systems facilitate curriculum development, course scheduling, and faculty workload management, enabling efficient and effective academic planning. Academic time table along with academic calendar is also facilitated through ERP.
- 24.1.7. **Examination Management:** ERP systems has automated exam registration, scheduling, grading, result processing, student exam ledger and statement of grades, reducing administrative burdens and enhancing result accuracy along with degree configurations, transcripts and related documents like migration certificate and provisional passing certificate.
- 24.1.8. **Library Management:** Stocking of books/journals/CDs/DVDs/magazines management, membership management, catalogue management, Online Public Access Control (OPAC), transactions, and reporting.

### 24.2. Role of ERP in Administrative Efficiency

Enhancing Administrative Efficiency, the MGMU ERP system has streamlined administrative processes leading to improved efficiency:

- 24.2.1. **23.2.1. Human Resource Management:** ERP systems manage employee records, Muster, roaster, service book, leave accounting, salaries, fees, inward/outward, documentation, and related reports.
- 24.2.2. **Financial Management:** ERP systems manage financial transactions, accounting, and procurement, providing real-time financial visibility and control. Expense and advance vouchers, ledgers, trial balance, expenditures, income statements, expense statements and statistical reporting.
- 24.2.3. **Purchase:** Vendor management, letter of intent, quotation, purchases order, invoicing, delivery challan generation, bill payments, receipts making and reporting.
- 24.2.4. **Inventory Management:** Movement of items, procurement management, stock management, distribution, inventory control, reordering and reporting.

## 25. Innovation Incubation Research Center

MGM University has collaborated with leading companies from different sectors to establish this state-of-the-art centre. The first of its kind research and learning centre in Maharashtra, IIRC is equipped with some of the most advanced technical equipment, with which students work on complex industry problems using emerging technologies like AI, Machine Learning and Internet of Things (IoT) under the guidance of faculty and industry experts. Some of the facilities in the centre areas follows: Robotics, Mechatronics, Industrial Automation, Computer Integrated Manufacturing, Electric Vehicle, Advanced Driver Assistance System (ADAS), Unmanned Aerial Vehicle (DRONE), Additive Manufacturing & Reverse Engineering.

The Innovation Incubation & Research Centre (IIRC) at MGM University not only empowers its students with the advanced knowledge of their field through practical training but also offers design consultancy and rapid prototyping for research work to industries.

The unique infrastructure has been established with an objective and vision that it should meet the future demands of all types of Industries starting from design to Manufacturing and Rapid Prototyping to Industry 4.0 and provide technological solutions to industry challenges. Inculcating a research aptitude and an entrepreneurial way of thinking in the students, IIRC is thus a gateway to infinite opportunities for the engineering student at MGM University.

A brief account of innovation projects undertaken in IIRC labs is as follows:

### AM & RE Lab Projects

#### Prototype for Worm Gear: Motorcycle Speedometer

As a part for its consultancy services, IIRC designed Worm Gear for motor cycle speedometer and material characterizations. Total 27 specimens were 3D printed under this project for testing different parameters. The dedicated team, which carried out the project successfully consisted of Dr. Nitin Phafat (IIRC Incharge), Prof. M. N. Bargir, Mr. Kishore Mate and Mr. Prashant Murmude.

Another interesting consultancy project that IIRC carried out was prototype design and 3D printing of a garlic peeling machine. The Rotor Manufacturing Process for this project was carried out at AM & RE LAB at IIRC. This project was accomplished under the “Innovative Idea Accelerator Program 2021” by TATA Technologies Pune, MASSIA, Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar & IEPC (Innovation and Entrepreneurship Promotion Center).

#### Pressure biofeedback device” For Physiotherapy

As an important contribution to the field of healthcare, IIRC has designed a ‘Pressure Biofeedback Device’. The device provides valuable information to ensure precision in neck exercises and muscle testing in physiotherapy. It allows the physiotherapist and the patient to determine if the patient is able to selectively isolate and maintain contractions of the cervical or lumbopelvic core stabilization muscles. The measuring range of this device is 0-30 lbs digital pressure with an accuracy of 0.1 gm pressure. The device includes a resting pad with base, pressure sensors, and a digital remote monitor. The passionate team that developed this design included Dr. Nitin Phafat (IIRC Incharge).

#### Tibia Bone Analysis

Students of Biomedical utilised the cutting-edge Hexagon Arm-83, 3-D scanner to delve into the intricacies of human bone structure. They 3D printed a replica after scanning human bones, bringing theoretical knowledge to life.

#### Drone Lab Projects

##### Land Surveying With A Drone (UAV)

The Innovation Incubation & Research Centre surveyed a land area of 16 acres at a Pump house in Gandheli, Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar by using RGB Phantom 4 DJI Drone. A number of photographs of the area were taken from different angles by the RGB camera and each image was tagged with coordinates under this survey. After successful completion of the survey, a

topographical GIS report was also prepared. The project was carried out by Prof. M N Bargir, Pankaj Dhoble, Laxmikant Kokate, Amol Mahadik, Vishal Ghatge and IIRC team members.

### **Design and Development of Autonomous Quadcopter**

An aspiring team of students of Mechanical Engineering - Rajendra Vaijinath Bhalekar, Sushil Asaram Shelke, Kunal Shailesh Wankhade and Shivprasad Devling Zadbuke chose drone technology as their project work, titled “Design and Development of Autonomous QuadCopter”. The project was completed successfully with help of IIRC team. They were also able to calibrate and turn the drone. The team also designed 3-D printed covers for the drone body. The frame used here was X type frame. The controller is Pixhawk 2.4.8 flight controller. In order to make it an autonomous drone, GPS and Telemetry systems were also incorporated into it. The selection of motors and battery was done according to the thrust calculations.

### **Design and Development of Autonomous Hexacopter Drone**

Another creative team of students from Mechanical Engineering Department consisting of Rishi Pankaj Pahade, Yash Pradeep Lodha, Manish Chandrakant Pawar and Tejas Pratap Patil designed and developed an ‘Autonomous Hexacopter Drone’ under the guidance of Prof. M.N. Bargir and with the support of the IIRC team. Initially, the students studied the different types of drones, the components they are made up of and their applications. After a thorough study, they decided to create a hexacopter drone as it offers more in-air stability compared to a quadcopter drone. Instead of using the already available standard drone components, they prepared an in-house drone design in CREO. After a lot of testing, the body material was chosen to be a Flexible Acrylic Sheet, which was later cut and framed using an in-house laser cutting machine. The arms of the drone were made from carbon fibre rods. Couplings were designed 3D printed in ABS for holding arms with the frame. The controller used was Pixhawk 2.4.8 flight controller. The GPS and Telemetry System were also included in the drone. The selection of motors and battery was done according to the thrust calculations.

### **CIM LAB Project**

#### **Measurement of Ra Value**

IIRC is equipped with the Mitutoyo SJ410P Surface Roughness Tester. The SurfTest SJ-410 surface roughness measuring instrument here, offers numerous innovative features to provide smoother operation and more accurate measurements. It’s an easy-to-use, portable unit with a high straightness specification of 0.3 – 0.5µm over a traverse length of 25 – 50mm.

#### **Roboguide**

IIRC has also designed a fantastic ROBOGUIDE that leads the visitors through the Innovation Incubation and Research Center (IIRC). The ROBOGUIDE runs on an embedded Arduino-based system. The line follower mechanism has been achieved using an IR sensor which tracks the white line and stops at every lab when it detects a cross black line. It provides thorough information of each lab using audio commands.

### **Industrial Hydraulics Pneumatics Workshop**

MGM University in association with Quality Circle Forum of India (QCFI), Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar Chapter started need-based, customized training programmes for industries in the region. The program focused on training in areas like Industrial Hydraulics, Pneumatics, and Industrial Robotics. The workshop was held on 21st & 22nd March 2022 involving participants from Dhananjay Group, Accrete Electricals Pvt. Lt. and Badve group of Industries, Waluj Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar. The customized training programmes are developed around different levels of the content, language suitability, duration of the program and flexible schedules. A comprehensive feedback system ensures continuous improvement in the programmes and processes. Due care is also taken to ensure that the benefit reaches local industries and people.

### **Workshop on “Prototype: Process, Design & Development Prototyping” for Physiotherapy students**

To foster the culture of innovation amongst the students of MGM School of Physiotherapy, IIRC conducted a three days workshop on “Prototype: Process, Design & Development Prototyping” in

Additive Manufacturing & Reverse Engineering Lab from 9<sup>th</sup> June to 11<sup>th</sup> June 2023 In this workshop, various activities that focus on innovative ideas, innovations, and how to take these innovations forward into the world of start-ups through 3D printing Technology were conducted. Activities, featuring a design of a medical gadget on Catia software and guiding students to do its 3D printing on Stratasys 3d Printer throughout the process were performed.

Students of MGM School of Physiotherapy have designed Knee pads to safeguard against impact and provide cushioning when kneeling. Taken together, A-pose and re-aligned bent knee data provided the basis for knee shape analysis to support the knee-pad design. Stratasys 3D printer was used to manufacture the Knee pad.

The progress of MGM University and its students is interdependent, with the university's growth reflected in the achievements of its students. Vice-Chancellor Dr. Sapkal encouraged the graduates to stay updated, pursue innovation, and excel in their fields through research and experimentation, thereby transforming challenges into opportunities and achieving success.

## Degrees Conferred

Degrees were awarded to students who completed various courses between 2021 and 2023. Among the 867 graduates, 353 received undergraduate degrees, 443 received postgraduate degrees, 42 earned diplomas, 20 completed postgraduate diplomas, and 9 received certificates. These graduates came from diverse fields such as engineering and technology (70), basic and applied sciences (305), management and commerce (291), social sciences and humanities (138), performing arts (15), interdisciplinary education (14), and design (34).

## Posthumous D.Litt. Degree for Mahakavi Vamandada Kardak

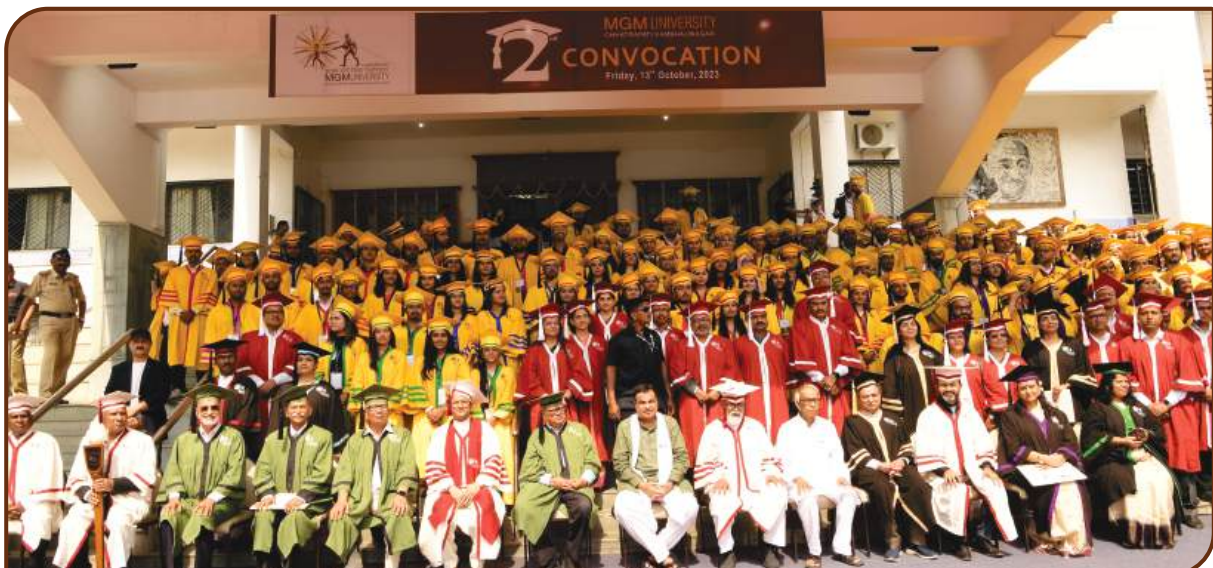
A posthumous D.Litt degree was conferred upon Mahakavi Vamandada Kardak by MGM University. The degree was accepted on his behalf by his relatives—Muktabai Deoram Wagh (sister-in-law), Shobhana Popat Jadhav (niece), Ravindra Vaman Kardak (son), and Komal Ravindra Kardak (granddaughter). Vamandada Kardak, a renowned poet and follower of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar, contributed significantly to the Ambedkarite movement through over 10,000 songs and writings that reflected Dr. Ambedkar’s ideals. He authored four poetry collections, an autobiography titled Maza Jeevanacha Gaan (The Song of My Life), and lyrics for several films. He is remembered as a pivotal figure in Dalit activism, promoting the philosophies of Gautam Buddha, Mahatma Phule, and Dr. Ambedkar, inspiring generations through his work.

## 31. Best Practices

MGM University follows several best practices, many of which it has inherited from its founder body – Mahatma Gandhi Mission Trust and have stood the test of time. These practices have helped the university achieve impactful and long-lasting outcomes. They also gave it its own unique identity.

### 31.1. University level Best Practices

#### 31.1.1. Mentor-Mentee Program:

Mentoring provides genuine support and guidance to students who are experiencing challenges in learning due to educational, social, emotional and behavioural problems that are consequently affecting their learning and performance. Effective mentoring seeks to offer motivation, rock-support, directive guidance and role modelling to mentees. Mentor- Mentee Programme is a highly valuable development activity which is firmly implemented at all the constituent colleges of MGMU. Mentoring helped the students to choose the right career option and pursue their choice with focus and dedication. Mentoring also helped the mentees to decide on how to choose a relevant workshop, seminar and value added course of their specialization.

#### 31.1.2. Feedback Mechanism:

At MGMU to evaluate the existing teaching-learning environment and curriculum and to take appropriate action for the improvement of poor performing areas a strong feedback system is designed. At the end of each semester curriculum feedback, teacher feedback, teaching pedagogy feedback and infrastructure and other resources available feedback is taken manually as well as through online platforms like Google forms, ERP learning management system. Apart from this feedback from employers and alumni is also taken.

#### 31.1.3. Environment Conservation:

At MGMU special focus on dissemination of environmental literacy for motivating students, teachers and supporting staff has been implemented. Transformation of the campus into a pollution free and environmentally friendly eco zone is the main objective of this practice. MGMU with various sustainable initiatives has worked to develop an eco-friendly, sustainable campus and to disseminate the concept of eco-friendly culture. Activities like Ganpati making Workshop, Varsha Mangal celebration, Clean India campaign etc.

#### 31.1.4. Experiential Learning:

All the constituent colleges of MGMU have adopted the student centered framework which includes practices like interactive learning, participatory learning, ICT enabled learning and innovative practices of learning. All of these bring about an all-encompassing growth in the students' knowledge acquisition. Bridge course is an initiative that enables students to bridge the gap between the academically weak and strong students by solving subject specific problems of the former. Initiatives like guest lectures by industry experts, seminars, workshops are also conducted to expose the students to advanced levels of information. Departmental activities like Induction Program, Freshers, Cultural Fest are organized keeping in mind curriculum related needs. This becomes a creative platform of learning that encourages students to transform classroom knowledge into quizzes, debates, games and technical exhibits. Innovative methodology projects include MGM Community Radio 90.8 and Bai Manus where students experience hands-on training and also can do internship Hands On training & Internship.

#### 31.1.5. Interfaith Prayer:

MGMU Gandhian Studies department organises weekly interfaith prayer for staff and students to offer spiritual value. This prayer helps in keeping the mind and the soul peaceful. The main objective is to inculcate moral and ethical values among the staff and students and to develop their behaviour. Prayer enhances the team spirit, self-confidence, leadership quality and strengthens personality. In the context of increasing antagonism among diverse communities in the country, students require a clear perspective. Hence every week one institute of the MGMU organizes the interfaith prayer. Students of all institutes and the organizing institute in particular attend.

#### 31.1.6. Inculcating Gandhian Values:

To inculcate the Gandhian ideology amongst the students and society, MGMU is organizing various activities like lecture series, competition and visit to various places like Wardha (Sevagram Ashram). This practice helps in exposing non-violence practice, dissemination of Gandhian ideology for the betterment of the society.
